



Getting Started

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| #1. <i>Get a Dog</i> | <i>Your dog must be at least 6 months old, not in heat, no injuries or open wounds and must be handled by someone at least 7 years old.</i> |
| #2. <i>Throwing Object</i> | <i>Have a floatable device for your dog to retrieve. It cannot be edible, alive or ever have been alive.</i> |
| #3. <i>Practice</i> | <i>Once you have your participator wristband use the open dock time to practice with your dog the day of the event. Practice and condition your dog before your next event at the nearest dock jumping facility in your area. Please visit our website or welcome tent for more information.</i> |
| #4. <i>Register</i> | <i>Register online for pre-registration and the best wave selection. You can also register on-site at the event <u>if</u> the event is not full.</i> |
| #5. <i>Participate</i> | <i>Please attend the mandatory handlers meeting prior to each wave. All dogs must maintain the required 8 foot distance between each other in the holding area and stay on a leash when they are not on the dock. Only one person on the dock at a time during competition.</i> |
| #6. <i>Awards</i> | <i>Visit the registration desk after each wave to pick up your placement ribbon. Also check back at the end of all waves to determine if your dog made it to one of the speed retrieve or big air final rounds!</i> |
| #7. <i>FUN</i> | <i>This sport is about fun for you and your dog!</i> |
